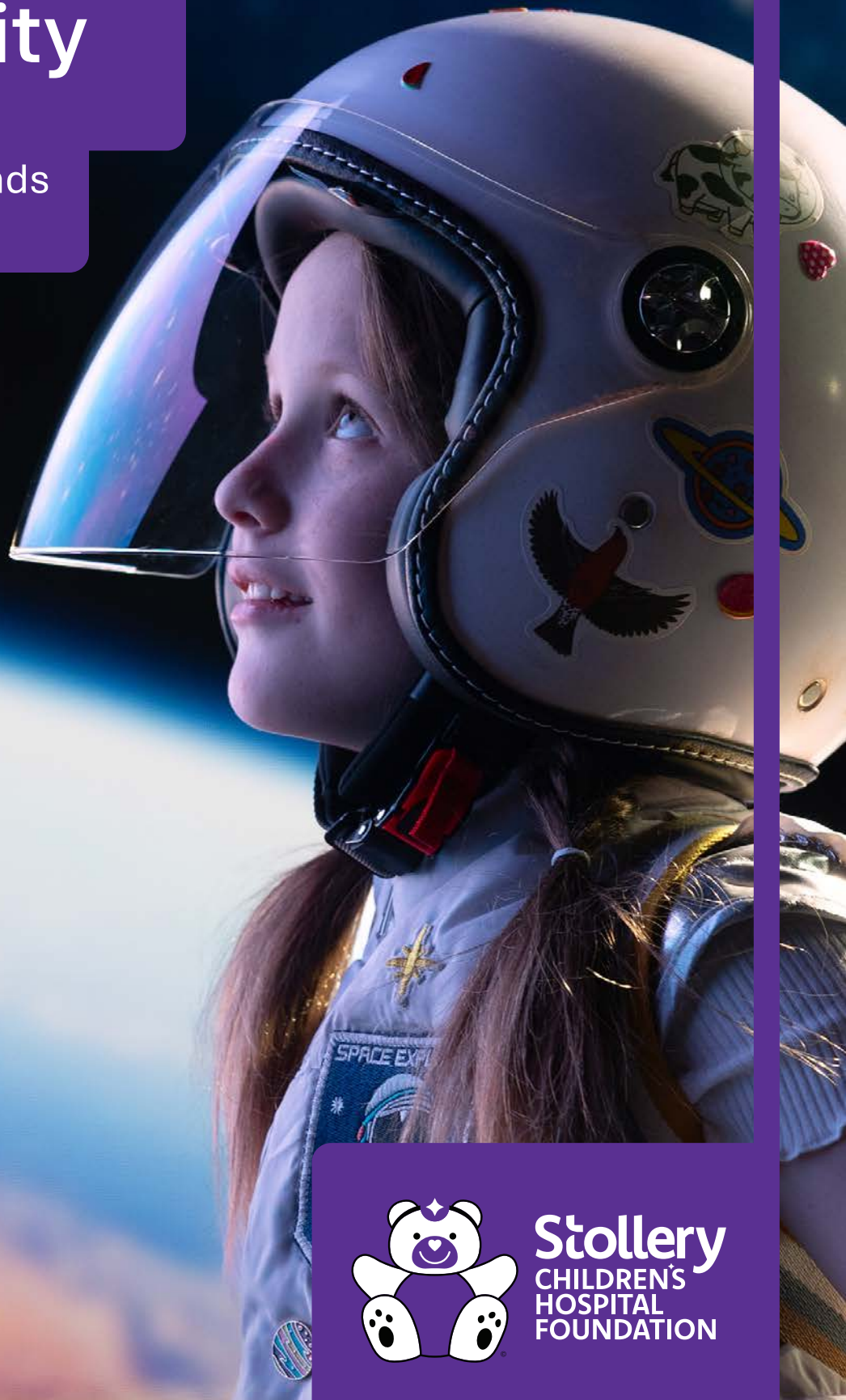

For 25 years, our community has come together around a shared belief that all kids deserve the best chance to live a long and healthy life.

That belief has shaped the Stollery we know today. It’s helped fund leading-edge equipment, groundbreaking research, specialized training and programs that support kids and families. And now, it’s driving an ambitious vision for what comes next.

This year, we launched **Stollery No Bounds**, a once-in-a-generation, \$1 billion fundraising campaign to transform children’s health care. Together, we’re investing in world-class care for kids today while building a new, stand-alone Stollery Children’s Hospital for tomorrow.

Together, over the last year, we’ve:

- **Advanced highly specialized care** through programs like Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation (ECMO), with the Stollery becoming the only children’s hospital in Canada to hold the ELSO Platinum Center of Excellence designation, the organization’s highest honour for quality, safety and continuous improvement (pg. 12).
- **Fueled groundbreaking research** through the new Stem Cell Core, where researchers are growing three-dimensional models of human organs to better understand diseases and explore potential treatments for kids (pg. 22).
- **Expanded family-centred care** with the support of Pumbaa, the first dedicated Child Life Services Facility Dog at any children’s hospital in Canada, who has already supported more than 830 interventions across 16 Stollery units (pg. 18).
- **Invested in the next generation of pediatric specialists** through more than \$2 million in funding for specialized fellowships at the University of Alberta (pg. 26).

And so much more.

This year alone, the Stollery provided expert care during 377,947 patient visits. Behind every one of those visits is a kid and family counting on the Stollery for answers, hope and the very best care possible.

CRITICAL CARE AT THE STOLLERY

The Stollery's Pediatric Critical Care programs provide critical medical care to children within the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) and the Pediatric Cardiac Intensive Care Unit (PCICU).

The Critical Care Transport Teams make it possible for these vital programs to support critically ill kids from across Alberta, Western Canada and the three territories – from premature infants all the way to 17-year-old teenagers, the Stollery Critical Care Team is there.

GO WITH THE FLOW

The Stollery is home to one of the most advanced life-support programs for critically ill children in Canada – receiving the highest level of international recognition for its work.

Extracorporeal Membrane Oxygenation, or ECMO, is a form of life support used for patients with severe heart or lung failure who don't respond to conventional treatments. ECMO temporarily takes over the work of the heart and lungs, giving critically ill patients the precious time they need to heal.

The Stollery's ECMO Program is linked to the worldwide ECMO community through the **Extracorporeal Life Support Organization (ELSO)**. ELSO unites ECMO professionals to standardize care, publish research, develop guidelines and maintain a global patient registry. The Platinum Center of Excellence designation is ELSO's highest honour, awarded only to programs that demonstrate exceptional quality, safety and continuous improvement.

As of January 2026, the Stollery is the only children's hospital in Canada to hold the ELSO Platinum Center of Excellence designation.

ECMO first arrived in Edmonton in 1988, supporting newborns at the Royal Alexandra Hospital. By 2000, the program expanded into the Stollery's pediatric intensive care unit (PICU) – caring for medical, surgical and cardiac patients.

From 2018 to today, ECMO operates across both the pediatric cardiac intensive care unit and PICU, forming one of the strongest pediatric Extracorporeal Life Support (ECLS) programs in Canada.



As the Western Canadian referral centre for congenital heart disease surgery and solid organ transplantation, the Stollery's reach spans across the Prairies and territories.

For children too unstable to travel on conventional life support, the Stollery provides **ECMO transport** — a rare and highly advanced service extending to Calgary, Winnipeg, Saskatoon, Regina, Vancouver – and beyond. **Last year, the team completed 12 ECMO transports**, making sure the sickest kids across Western Canada can reach specialized care safely.

With your support, we can continue supporting highly specialized programs like ECMO that show there are **No Bounds** to what's possible in pediatric critical care.

ENCOURAGING COLLABORATION FOR STOLLERY TEAMS

Stollery supporters were out in full swing at last year's Tee Up For Tots golf invitational, proudly presented by the Thompson Family Foundation, raising more than \$1.2 million and helping purchase specialized equipment that will help streamline things in the operating room.



While marking 25 years of Tee Up For Tots and celebrating 10 years of the Thompson Family Foundation's presenting sponsorship, we brought our community together for a weekend of golf and generosity in beautiful Jasper, AB. In addition to a weekend full of golf and activities, we were also able to raise enough funds to purchase much-needed pediatric equipment for the Stollery.

Typically, when an ear, nose and throat (ENT) surgeon receives a consultation to see an airway issue in a young patient, they view the child's airway through a bronchoscope. If any other care provider wants to watch, they have to look over their colleague's shoulder or take turns looking into the scope.

Thanks to our 2025 Tee Up For Tots golfers, guests and sponsors, we're able to help support improved visualization and collaboration through the purchase of the ENT Telepak System.

The ENT Telepak System is an all-in-one system that combines a monitor, LED light source, camera, internal memory and network integration capability, allowing care teams to view the procedure on a monitor at the same time, while also capturing and saving images to the child's file. **The ENT Telepak System allows for real-time visualization and greater collaboration among clinicians caring for Stollery patients in the operating room.**



No more fear

BUZZING TO EASE KIDS' PAIN

While Buzzy may seem small, don't be fooled by how much of an impact this little bee can make.



The Stollery Children's Hospital is one of only 23 hospitals in the world to receive the ChildKind International certification – a program dedicated to pain management for kids.

One small, bee-shaped part of this story is Buzzy – the needle fear and pain relief tool.

Thanks to your support, the Stollery can help reduce young patients' pain with the high frequency vibration tool that helps block pain signals before they reach the brain. It can be used before and during vaccinations, injections, infusions, blood draws and more.

Today, Buzzy is supporting kids across the Stollery, from inpatient and outpatient clinics to the emergency department, focus more on healing, not on fears.



Safest together

SAFER CARE STARTS WITH LEARNING

Stollery kids are benefiting from lessons learned at children's hospital across North America – and Stollery staff have the training and tools to keep every child who walks through the doors safe.



The Stollery Children's Hospital joined a network of children's hospitals across Canada and the United States in 2017, working together to prevent harm and improve the quality of care.

The network is called Solutions for Patient Safety (SPS). Hospitals in the network share ideas, data and best practices instead of working in isolation, so every member of the hospital can learn from what's working at the other pediatric centres. At the Stollery, this shared effort is known as Safest Together.

Every month, Stollery teams track specific measures of patient safety and compare results with other children's hospitals across North America. That comparison shows the team where they're ahead and where there's still work to do, while giving them access to solutions already tested elsewhere.

Being part of the network has changed how safety is approached across the Hospital. Rather than working in silos, thanks to donors like you, the Stollery team can collaborate on patient safety using shared training, tools and standards from across the SPS network.

Support from donors like you are helping fund:

- Attendance at workshops, conferences and educational sessions with pediatric safety experts across North America
- Membership in a network of children's hospitals committed to reducing preventable harm

Mending a broken heart

IMPROVING OUTCOMES FOR CARDIAC KIDS

Heart failure and cardiomyopathy represent some of the most critically ill pediatric patients – thanks to your support, the Pediatric Heart Function and Cardiomyopathy program is here to help.

The Pediatric Heart Function and Cardiomyopathy program at the Stollery cares for kids with various forms of heart disease associated with heart failure and those who are at risk for heart failure issues. **What started as 53 outpatients in 2014 has grown to nearly 800 patients with no signs of slowing down.** The program also provides an inpatient consulting service, with new consults increasing by more than 30 per cent in the last year.

The team, consisting of four cardiologists, a nurse practitioner and a registered nurse co-ordinator is continuously working towards developing strategic and sustainable initiatives to improve both patient care and efficiency of service.

Since 2023, donor support has allowed them to successfully develop family-targeted educational infographics, quality improvement initiatives, the introduction of new and novel clinical therapies, integration of patient tools into the electronic medical record, development of a cardiac genetics clinic and the successful launch of a Home Inotrope Program to support kids in end-stage heart failure who are waiting for a heart transplant and would otherwise have to wait in hospital.

Their expertise in pediatric cardiomyopathy has resulted in annual **accreditation by the Children's Cardiomyopathy Foundation** – a global community of families, physicians and scientists focused on improving diagnosis, treatment and quality of life for kids with cardiomyopathy.

Striving to keep improving, the team has built a strategic partnership with the Advanced Cardiac Therapies Improving Outcomes Network (ACTION). This international community is helping the team optimize the use of telehealth, understand referral patterns for patients with failing Fontan physiology, harmonize care for those with Duchenne muscular dystrophy and develop a heart failure communication checklist for inpatient rounds and discharge summaries. The team is also involved in the development of



the new ACTION cardio-oncology committee with a goal to improve outcomes for kids who experience cardiomyopathy and heart failure after chemotherapy. This collaboration will continue as the team also works to implement a communication checklist, discharge summary tools and more.

While the program continues to experience exponential growth, the team remains committed to improving the experience for cardiac kids and their families, while also streamlining workflows to better understand the programs' activity. Your commitment to innovation is playing a key role in the future of cardiac care at the Stollery.

Sibling care support

STOLLERY SUPPORT FOR THE SIBLINGS

When a Stollery kid brings along their brother or sister to an appointment or emergency admission, supporters like you help make sure they're also being cared for.



When a kid comes to the Stollery, they never come alone. They bring with them grownups – like parents, guardians or grandparents; and kids – like brothers and sisters. When that child needs specialized care, their grownups want to be at their bedside. But what about their siblings?

For families travelling from rural and remote communities, new to Canada or without loved ones nearby, finding reliable childcare can become one more worry during an already stressful time. And let's face it – the Stollery is not the ideal place for a healthy child to just “hang out”.

Thanks to donors like you, siblings of kids receiving treatment at the Stollery have access to a safe and welcoming place at Kepler Academy, conveniently located across the street from the Hospital. The Stollery Social Work team assists and helps determine which families are most in need of these limited sibling childcare spots through Kepler Academy.

Because of your generosity, grownups don't have to make an impossible choice. They can support their sick or injured child, knowing the Stollery sibling is safe in a child-friendly space.



Meet Pumbaa

CANADA'S FIRST DEDICATED FACILITY DOG

In June 2025, the Stollery Children's Hospital introduced the newest Child Life Services team member, Pumbaa.



What's creamy, soft and loves treats? Pumbaa—the first dedicated **Child Life Services Facility Dog** at any children's hospital in Canada.

Pumbaa is a professionally trained, internationally accredited Facility Dog who provides individualized care focused on each patient's needs and goals. He helps Stollery kids through different tests and procedures like IV starts, echocardiograms, bloodwork and more. He also motivates and supports during physiotherapy sessions, provides emotional support during hard moments and brings comfort during a hospital stay.

Thanks to you and our community partners, we can support specialized programs like the Facility Dog program, giving Pumbaa the opportunity to bring comfort to Stollery kids and their families, making a hospital stay a little less scary.

Did you have to go to school to become a Facility Dog?

Yes! I trained for two whole years at Dogs with Wings here in Edmonton before joining the Stollery team. I learned how to stay calm in busy hospital hallways, follow lots of cues and use my skills to support patients.

What makes you the PAW-fect choice for a Facility Dog?

I'm gentle, patient and I love working with kids.

What is the most unique skill that you've learned?

I can do a "visit" where I rest my head gently on someone's lap or bed so kids can pet me without moving too much. I can also do a "squish" where I lay right alongside a patient in bed.

How do you rest your paws after a day of supporting Stollery kids?

I nap hard! I also go for long walks, play with my toys and get lots of cuddles at home with my primary handler, Angela, who is a Child Life Specialist at the Stollery.

Who's a good boy?

Me, obviously. But I like to think all the kids I meet are the real stars.

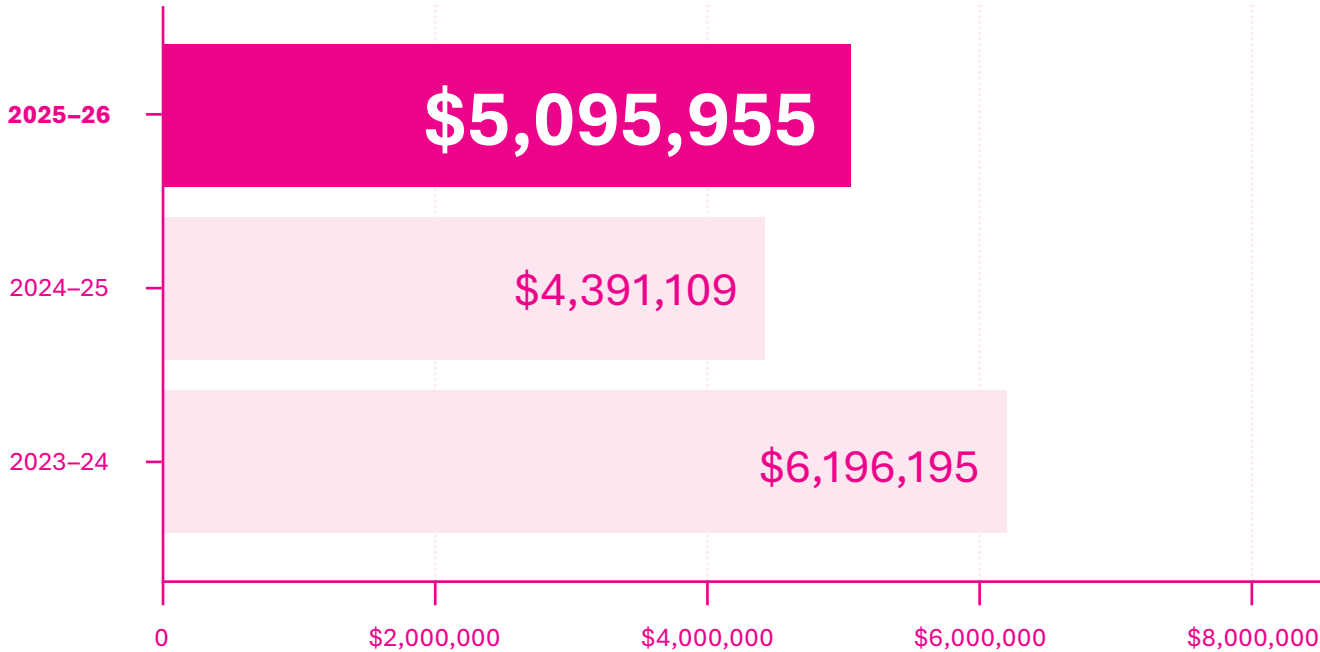

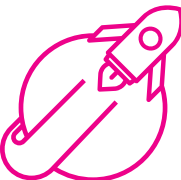

Tiny models, big impact

DISCOVERING NEW WAYS TO HELP KIDS

In the Stem Cell Core, human cell models help researchers study diseases and create personalized treatments to improve patient outcomes.

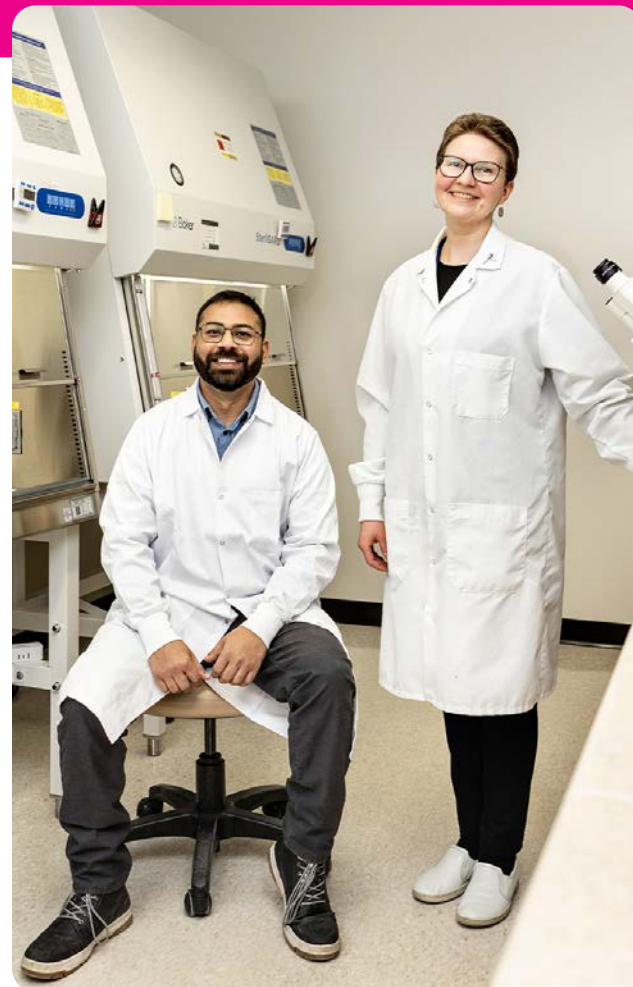
Foundation-funded researchers at the University of Alberta are growing three-dimensional, living models of human organs to help better understand diseases and conditions.

It's happening in the Stem Cell Core, located in the Stollery Children's Hospital Foundation Innovation Laboratories. Last year, the Women and Children's Health Research Institute (WCHRI) launched the Stem Cell Core, giving researchers at the University of Alberta new ways to study diseases that affect kids and families.

Using human stem cells, researchers can grow three-dimensional models of brains, spinal cords and placentas. These models more closely reflect human biology than traditional animal models, helping researchers better understand disease and test potential treatments. "Ultimately, a human is not a mouse," says Dr. Anastassia Voronova, academic lead of the Stem Cell Core.

Voronova is collaborating with Dr. Meghan Riddell to study how placental health during pregnancy may influence brain development. They are combining placental and neural tube models to better understand how the two are connected.

For Dr. Sandeep Gupta, the technology is helping answer questions about early human development that couldn't be explored before. Thanks in part to Foundation funding, Gupta joined the University of Alberta and the Stem Cell Core last year after being recruited from UCLA's David Geffen School of Medicine. His team is using stem cell models grown from patients with autism spectrum disorder to better understand how early spinal cord development may contribute to autism.



Together, these projects are helping researchers answer questions that couldn't be answered before while advancing WCHRI's work in precision health and more personalized care.

As the Stem Cell Core grows, more researchers will have access to the training and technology they need to explore new questions.

Thanks to your ongoing commitment to research, you're helping fund lifesaving and life-changing projects, improving outcomes and changing the way care is delivered.

A place for innovation

GIVING RESEARCHERS THE SPACE TO MAKE DISCOVERIES

In recognition of the Stollery Children's Hospital Foundation's dedication to pediatric health care research, lab space at the University of Alberta (U of A) has been renamed to celebrate the powerful partnership between the Foundation, the U of A and WCHRI.

The Stollery Children's Hospital Foundation Innovation Laboratories are located within the Katz Group Centre for Pharmacy and Health Research, housing 11 scientists conducting world-leading research in precision health. Their work ranges from decoding rare genetic diseases to developing new therapies for childhood brain tumours and kidney disorders. The space also be used to train future researchers and clinicians.

Between 2006 and March 2026, the Foundation has invested more than \$85.5 million in research through the Women and Children's Health Research Institute (WCHRI), and currently supports more than 325 researchers, working on more than 211 research projects and upwards of 200 clinical trials.

Thank you to our community of supporters, donors and advocates whose generosity allows our researchers the ability to explore bold ideas. Their work ranges from decoding rare genetic ideas and having the resources and space to translate them into real-life solutions.

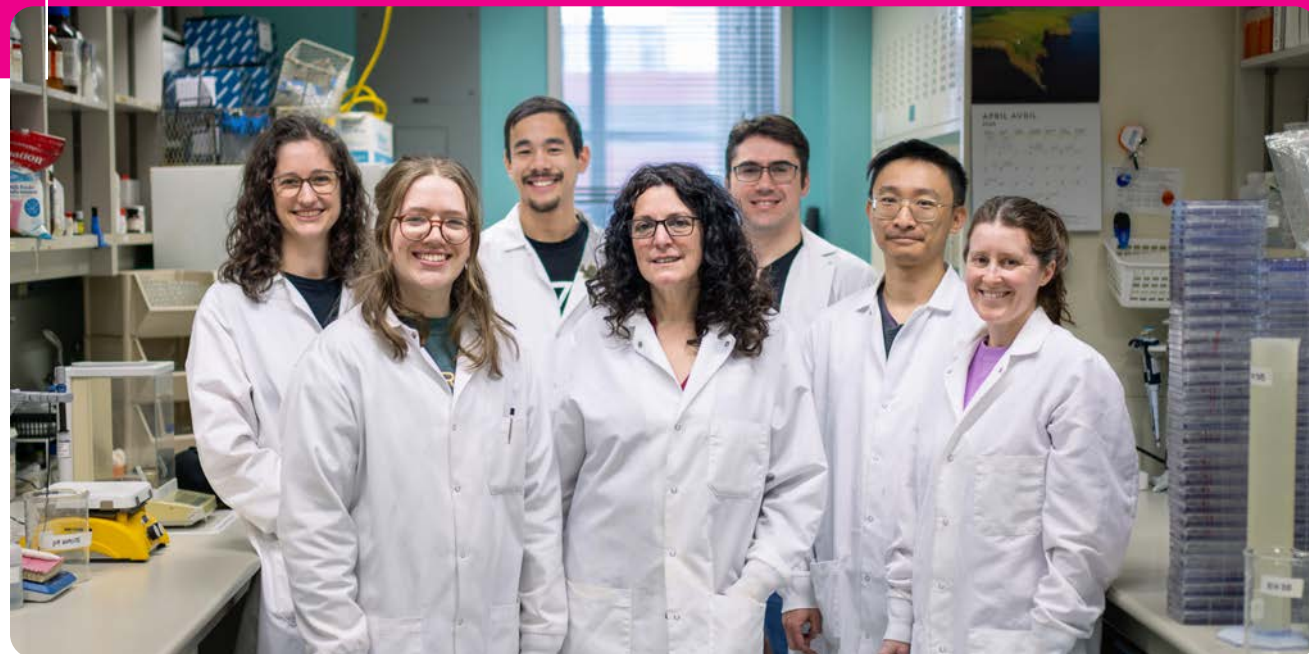

Rethinking the norm

WARMING UP THE HUNT FOR A CANCER CURE

By optimizing how cancer-fighting viruses are tested in the lab, Dr. Maya Shmulevitz is turning a century-old medical mystery into a precise, life-saving reality.



For more than 100 years, doctors have been chasing a medical mystery. A cancer patient reportedly cured after being bitten by a rabid dog sparked a fascinating theory: could a virus destroy cancer? Early attempts to recreate those results used dangerous viruses that sometimes shrank tumours but caused more harm than the cancer itself.

Today, University of Alberta virologist Dr. Maya Shmulevitz is exploring that same mystery using a harmless virus called a reovirus, which naturally lives in the human gut. One of her biggest breakthroughs came from an unexpected place: a buffet warming tray.

For decades, researchers tested how viruses attach to cells at 4°C, the temperature of a refrigerator.

“It’s just the way it’s always been done,” says Shmulevitz, a professor in the Department of Medical Microbiology & Immunology and Canada Research Chair in Molecular Virology and Immunotherapy.

Her team decided to test those same viruses at 37°C, human body temperature. Keeping the lab at that temperature was a challenge until a trainee with a background in food service suggested an unlikely solution: a buffet warming tray. “It was surprising how much difference this made,” Shmulevitz says.

By testing viruses at body temperature, her team could better identify which ones were the strongest hunters against cancer. Today, they’re mapping how these viruses bind to specific sugars on cell surfaces and have discovered that viruses with a lighter grip may spread farther through tumours than those that attach too tightly.

“It’s like a scout getting stuck at the front gate,” Shmulevitz says. “We want a weak binder so the scout can keep running through the whole fortress, opening as many windows as possible.”

Thanks to supporters like you, researchers like Dr. Shmulevitz can continue making discoveries that move cancer research forward.

Centering collectivity

THE FUTURE OF HEALTH RESEARCH

Dr. Keatton Tiernan’s work champions Indigenous views rooted in community and relationality.



Growing up in Dawson Creek, B.C., Dr. Keatton Tiernan spent his childhood outdoors, in the forests around Bear Mountain and the land where the prairies meet the foothills. Everything there depended on everything else. That understanding continues to shape his approach to health today.

Now a researcher at the University of Alberta’s Faculty of Kinesiology, Sport, and Recreation, Tiernan brings that perspective to the Indigenous Youth Mentorship Program. Supported by the Women and Children’s Health Research Institute (WCHRI), the program expanded to Alberta in 2016. Today, it pairs Indigenous high school students with elementary-aged kids in an after-school environment rooted in culture and connection.

The program is grounded in *Mino-bimaadiziwin/Mino-pimâtisiwin* — “living in a good way” in Anishinaabe and Cree. It reflects a holistic view of health that begins with community. Supported by the Foundation through a WCHRI graduate studentship, Tiernan explored how the program impacts its high school mentors.

His research found mentoring builds confidence and communication skills, makes school more enjoyable, increases employability and strengthens overall wellness. In a recently published paper, he used Indigenous beading as a metaphor for how those benefits are interconnected. His findings also highlighted the importance of offering high school course credits more consistently so more students can participate.

“Everything that I do is informed by relationality,” Tiernan says. “As individuals, we’re all a part of a community, and for a community to be healthy, all the individuals have to be healthy.”

Tiernan also chairs the WCHRI Trainee Advisory Committee, bringing together students, residents and fellows from across disciplines to share knowledge and connect with one another. His own path has shaped the researcher he is today. The first

in his family to graduate from high school, Tiernan considered a career in medicine before discovering community and population health, a holistic, community-centred field that reflected the teachings he grew up with.

Although Indigenous perspectives remain underrepresented in health research, Tiernan sees hope in the young people he mentors.

“They see things that can be changed and are willing to put in the work to change them,” he says.

Ultimately, he hopes the next generation of Indigenous researchers will have an easier path than he did.

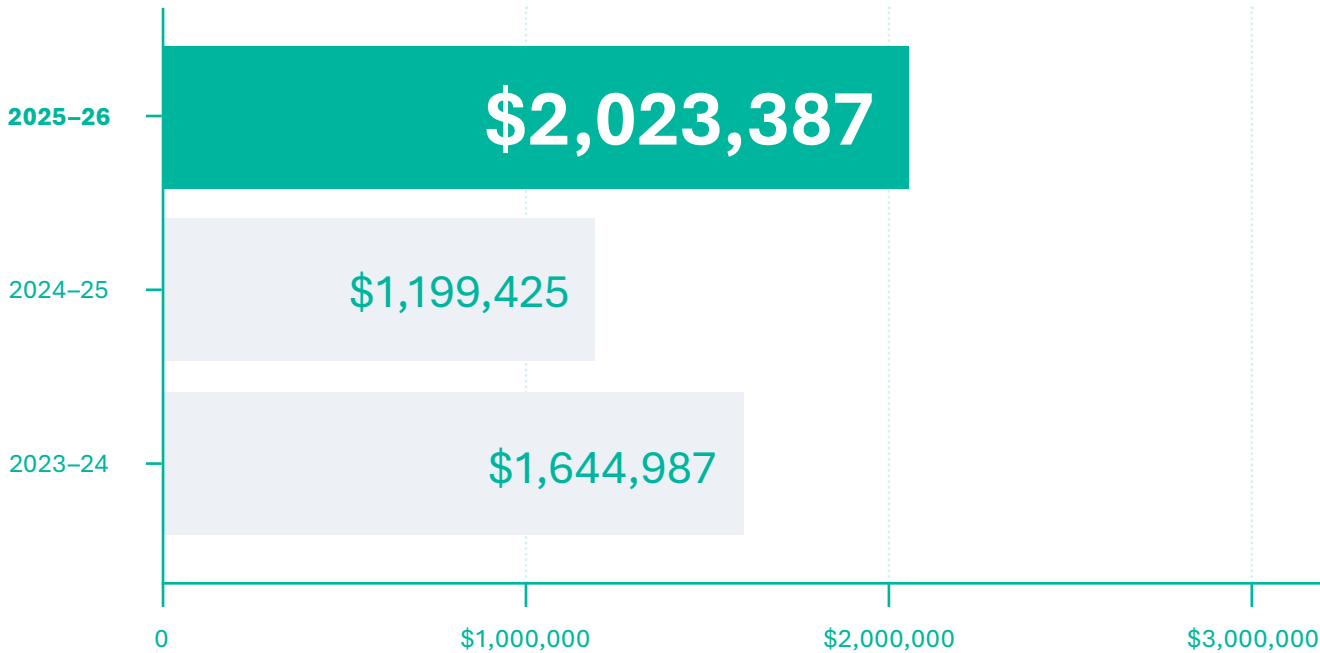

Learning from the best

FELLOWSHIPS ENCOURAGE MENTORSHIP BOTH NEAR AND FAR

Thanks to donor support, the University of Alberta’s Faculty of Medicine & Dentistry can support further training, effectively molding the next generation of Stollery specialists.

For Dr. Mallory McNiven, endocrinology has always felt personal.

Living with type 1 diabetes first sparked her interest in the field. As a kid, she imagined one day working at the Stollery. Years later, through medical school and residency, that early interest became something more certain.

“Every time I was in an endocrine clinic or in an endocrine rotation, I was like, this just clicks for me,” Mallory says.

Part of that connection came from the medicine itself. Mallory liked the logic of endocrinology and the way hormones connect to everything from growth and puberty to the thyroid, adrenal glands and diabetes. But she also understood something about the specialty from the other side of the exam room. Endocrinologists often care for the same kids for years, building relationships with them and their families along the way. Mallory remembers having her own endocrinologist for about a decade.

As her training progressed, another interest began to take shape.

Mallory had been drawn to both endocrinology and oncology when she encountered a patient with thyroid cancer during an endocrine clinic. She began to see an opportunity to bring those interests together while continuing to care for kids with diabetes. Dr. Rose Girgis helped her explore where that interest could lead.

Dr. Girgis, who specializes in thyroid cancer care at the Stollery, began inviting Mallory into her clinics and involving her in consultations. She helped Mallory pursue research, introduced her to other specialists and eventually became her fellowship director.



“She sort of took me under her wing and has guided me,” Mallory says.

That mentorship helped shape the next stage of Mallory’s training. With support from Stollery Children’s Hospital Foundation donors, Mallory completed a Foundation-funded fellowship in pediatric endocrinology, with a specialized focus on pediatric thyroid cancer. Her year included clinical care and research in Edmonton, along with experience in adult thyroid cancer clinics, nuclear medicine and radioactive iodine treatment.

It also took her beyond Edmonton. Through connections developed during her fellowship, Mallory spent two months at the Children’s Hospital of Philadelphia, where she trained alongside specialists in pediatric thyroid cancer, and learned to perform and interpret thyroid ultrasounds.

The experience opened Mallory’s eyes to what fellowship funding could make possible. She had initially thought of the funding largely as support for another year of training, instead, Foundation support helped make the Philadelphia experience possible.

For Mallory, one of the most important lessons from Philadelphia happened inside the clinic. Ultrasound machines were available where patients were being seen. A family could come for an appointment, have an ultrasound performed and review the images with their physician as part of the same visit.

Mallory hopes to eventually perform thyroid ultrasounds herself in clinic at the Stollery, allowing families to have imaging done and talk through what it shows as part of the same visit.

“None of the thyroid ultrasound skills that I have and I’m trying to continue to build on would have come without going to Philadelphia,” she says.

Mallory is now bringing that experience to her role as an attending physician with the Stollery’s pediatric endocrinology team.

While diabetes remains an important part of her work, she is building on her specialized training in thyroid nodules and thyroid cancer thanks to the research relationships she developed during her fellowship.

Mallory is just one example of how donors are helping create the next generation of specialists. Foundation-funding not only supports the pursuit of specialized training, it also helps build life-long mentorships and relationships that result in the best possible care for kids right here at the Stollery.

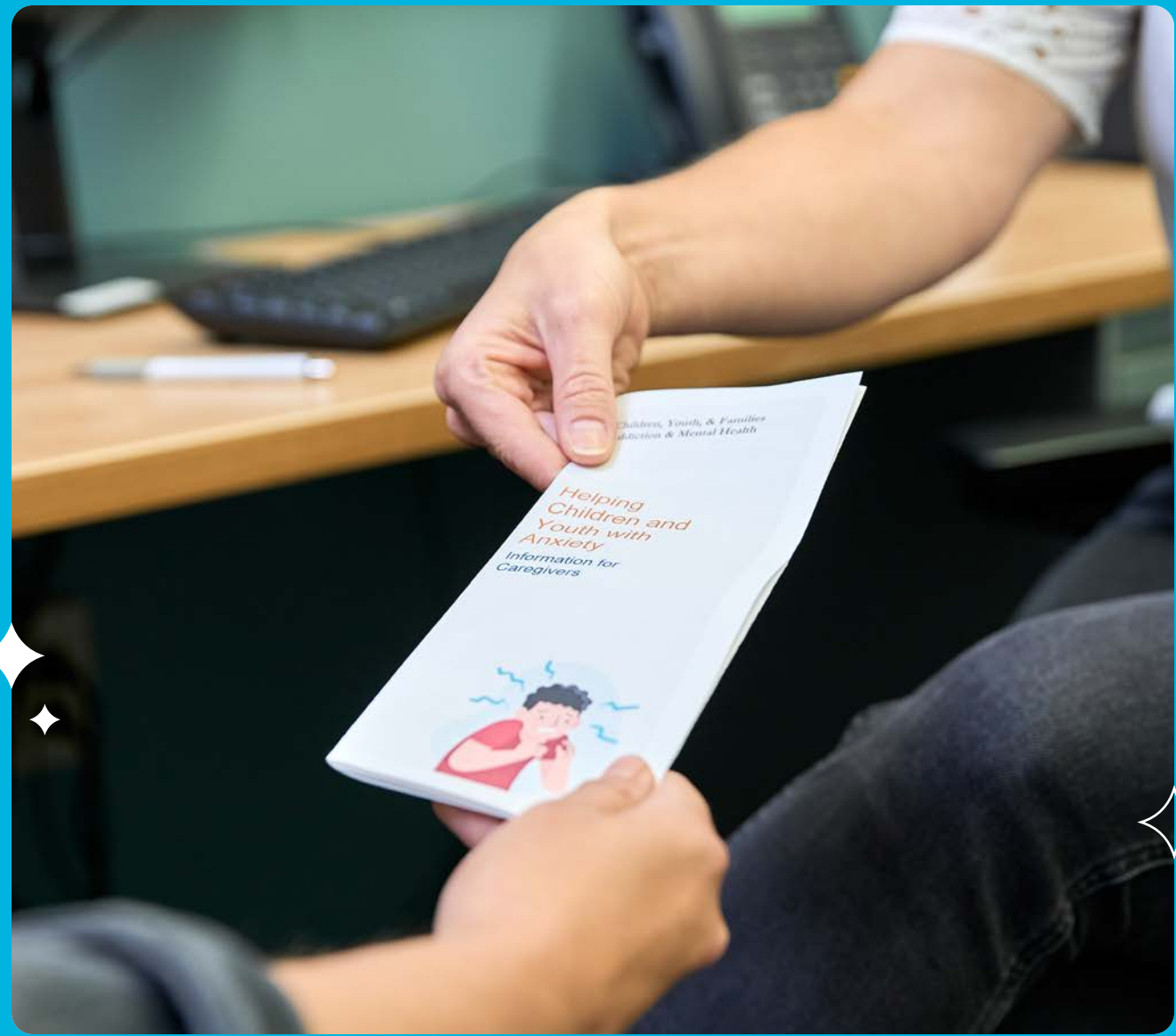

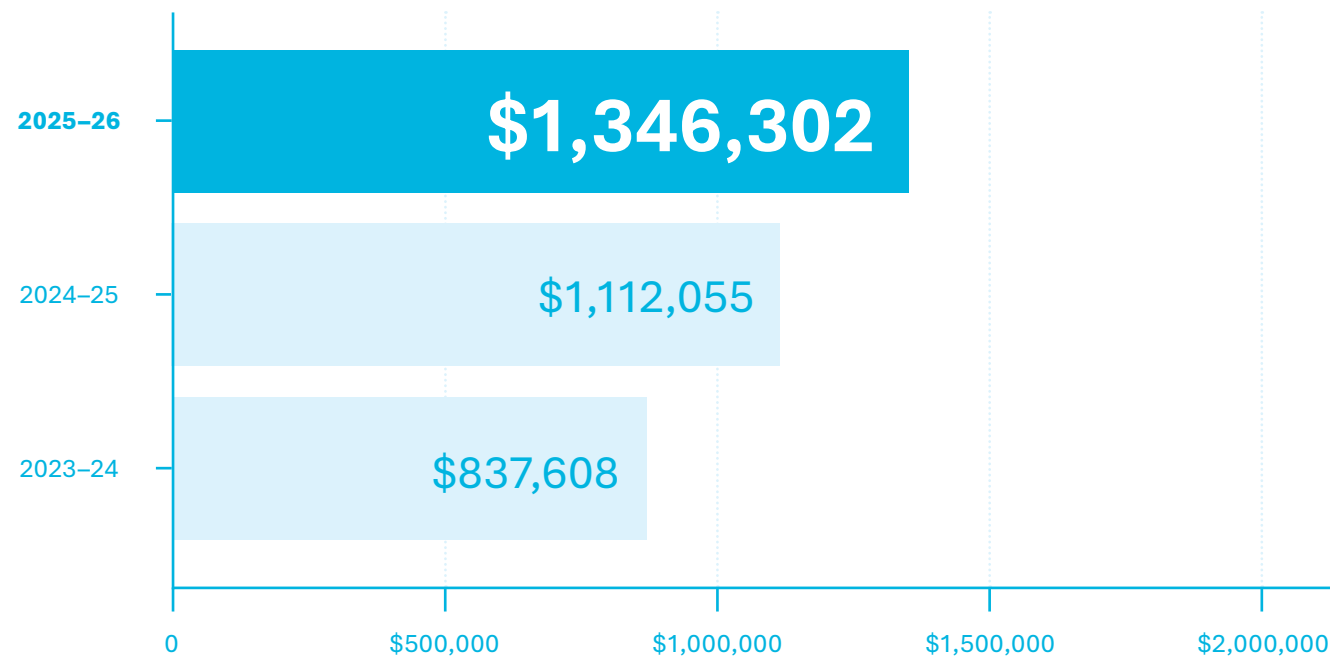

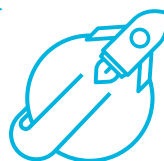

It takes a village

STRENGTHENING MENTAL HEALTH CARE AT THE STOLLERY

Mental health struggles are hard to see. That's why they can be the hardest for families to face.

Seventy per cent of all mental health problems begin in childhood or adolescence. Last year, more kids and teens came to the Stollery Emergency for a mental health crisis than for a broken bone.

Getting a kid through a crisis is only the first step. What happens next matters just as much. Co-ordination between the Stollery's emergency, inpatient and outpatient mental health teams means kids and youth get consistent care from crisis through recovery, instead of starting over at every stage. Clearer discharge planning and stronger connections to community supports help families stay steady once they leave the Hospital, so fewer end up back in crisis. And for many families, weekly caregiver groups and family counselling give parents real tools for the long road ahead, not just a plan on paper.

Donors like you fund the people who make this possible.

The Stollery's mental health team includes:

- A nurse who supports outpatient psychiatry, urgent care and pediatric consultation together
- Clinical nurse educators who trained pediatric nurses across Alberta this year, not just at the Stollery
- New nursing positions on the Emergency Mental Health Team, and a dedicated care manager overseeing the program
- A social worker who runs a weekly support group for caregivers
- A family support worker who helps kids and families connect to community resources after a hospital stay

When a kid's mental health crisis goes unmet, everything else in their life feels it too. At the Stollery, mental health care is health care. And because of you, youth in Alberta don't need to face it alone.



The Stollery is **one of the few children's hospitals in Canada** with clinical nurse educators dedicated specifically to kids' mental health.

TAKING STEPS TO FEEL SAFE AND SUPPORTED



When a 15-year-old Jessie* was admitted to the Stollery after an intentional overdose, her journey didn't end when she was ready to leave the hospital.

Before returning home, Jessie's care team worked closely with her and her family to develop a safety plan and connect them with the supports they would need in the days and weeks ahead. Those supports included counselling for Jessie and her family, caregiver education and follow-up to help make the transition home as safe as possible. Jessie's pediatrician also had access to child psychiatry expertise to support her ongoing care in the community.

Since leaving the hospital, Jessie and her mother have continued counselling together, strengthening their relationship and building a deeper understanding of one another. Together, they're creating a safer and more supportive environment at home.

At the Stollery, mental health care doesn't happen in one appointment or with one team. Experts across disciplines work together to provide compassionate, connected care that supports kids and families through every stage of their journey.

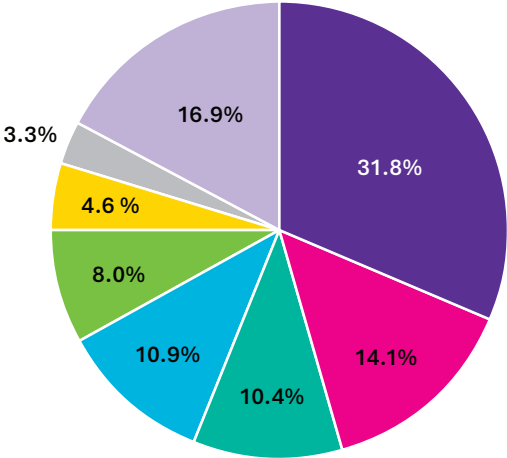

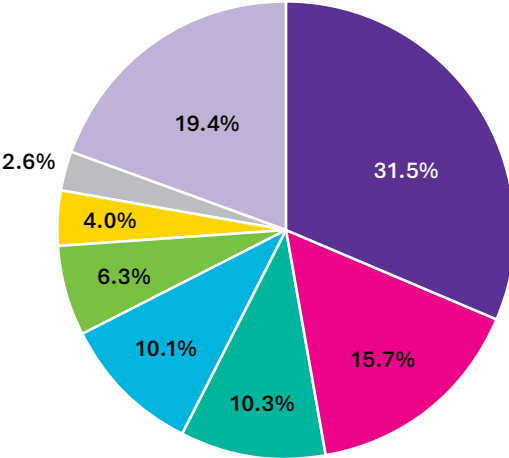

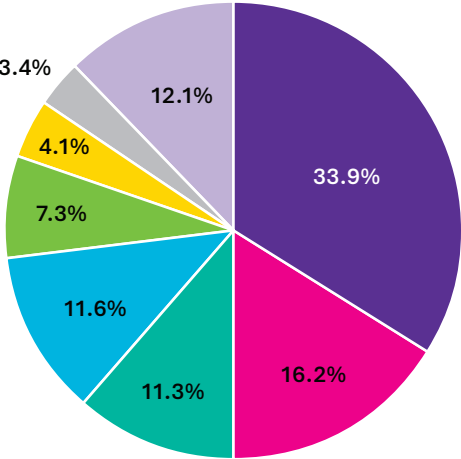
Fiscal 2026 Revenue

Why is the Foundation holding donor dollars for the Hospital? We establish our funding priorities each year based on priority needs identified by our expanding Stollery network of care.

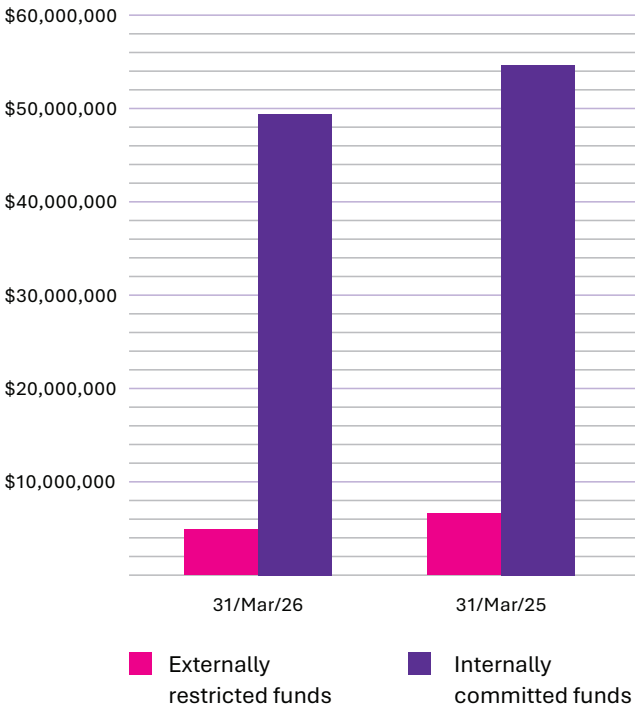
As of March 31, 2026, we are holding \$54.9 million (2025 - \$61.7 million) in internally committed and externally restricted funds for the Stollery Children’s Hospital, Alberta Health Services and the University of Alberta. These funds support our four key priorities for advancing children’s physical and mental health: equipment and facilities, programs, training and research.

This includes \$21.9 million approved by the Foundation’s Board of Trustees for fiscal 2027 funding priorities (2025 - \$21.1 million for fiscal 2026).

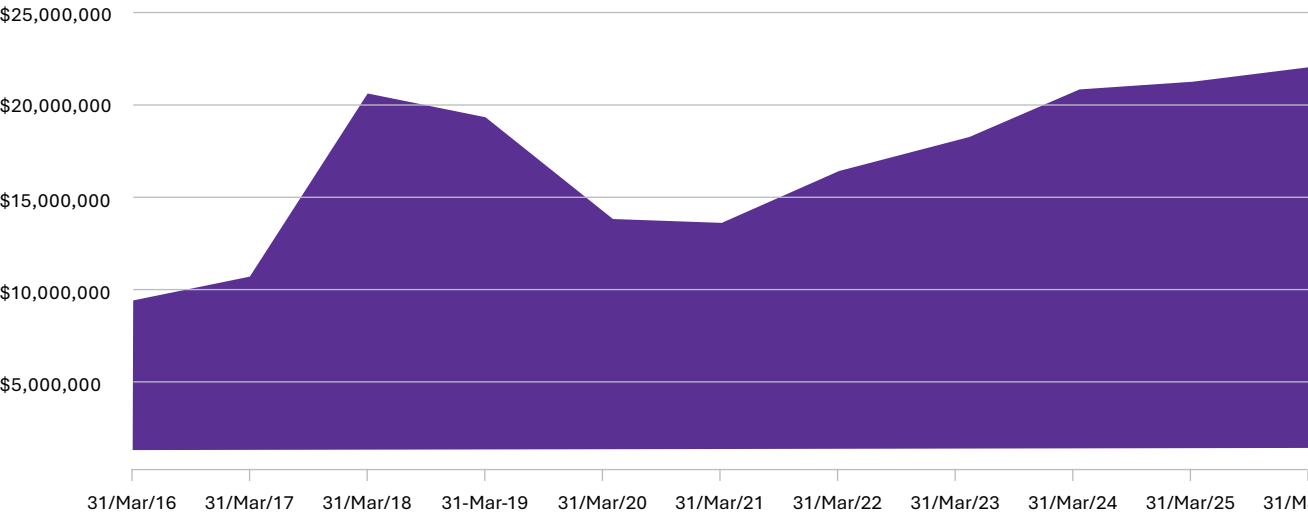
Delays in spending by our partner organizations, to whom we grant funds, can occur for various reasons. For instance, infrastructure project delays can postpone equipment purchases, program launches, and research activities. As well, in some cases, the Hospital requires additional time to test and evaluate equipment to ensure that the Foundation supports only the highest-quality, most appropriate technology for children’s health care.

As of March 31, 2026, we are also holding \$5.2 million (2025 - \$6.4 million) in externally restricted funds. These are donor-directed gifts designated for specific purposes that fall outside the scope of board-approved funding priorities.

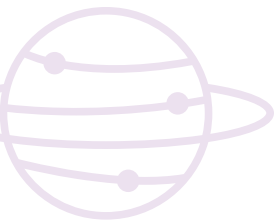

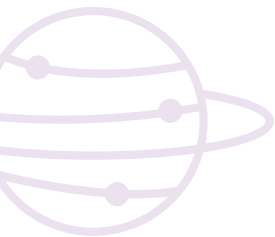
