Alberta's growing population is the youngest in Canada. This means more young families, and more kids who will need specialized care in the decades ahead. However, our province currently has no plan for children's health. Below is our solution for kids' health in Alberta.

Stollery network of care

We will provide more kids and families with greater access to the Stollery standard of care where they live.

This expanded network of care will include community outreach support, education programs and a standard of care for other health institutions to build on while being sensitive to community and cultural needs. It will also ensure the Stollery further expands its impact to Indigenous communities.

Stollery centre of excellence

We will build a standalone children's hospital, because the Stollery is running out of space to care for the sickest kids.

The Stollery Children's Hospital is one of the best in Canada, but the demand for its world-class care has nearly exceeded its capacity.

Our vision for a new hospital will merge pediatric excellence from locations across the U of A campus into one building designed specifically for children and families. Built to the highest standards with the most advanced equipment and facilities, the hospital will be a hub to the Stollery network of care, and increase the Hospital's capacity for surgical and inpatient beds, critical care, emergency response and mental health services.

A long-term plan for children's health

We will work with government to create a long-term plan for children's health in Alberta.

This comprehensive, long-term plan will include child-friendly policies that support equality and fairness for all children in Alberta, Indigenous health, mental health, and other critical aspects of health care.

- **44% of Stollery inpatients** are from outside Edmonton
- Alberta Health Services estimates the Stollery is **short 100 new inpatient beds**
- **84% of northern Albertans** surveyed support an expanded Stollery network of care
